The way to fight that argument is focus on the obscene, vulgar, and pornographic content without any reference to the type. Never use a phrase like "gay sex" because this brings homosexuality into it when it is just about the sex. Please be very careful with how you speak or write to anyone affiliated with schools or the media. Just trying to help.
